# **ABOUT THE COLLEGE:**

On the auspicious day of Shri Krishna Janmashtami, 15th August 1938, the people of Ghatkopar and the surrounding suburbs witnessed the birth of Hindi Vidya Prachar Samiti, a brain child of a visionary, Late Shri. Nandkishore Singh Jairamji. The Samiti was established with the objectives of catering to the educational needs of the Hindi speaking community. It made a humble beginning by starting a primary school, which gradually expanded into a full-fledged secondary school. The Hindi High School with its high academic standards has carved for itself a place not only among leading secondary schools in Mumbai but also educational institutions imparting instructions in Hindi throughout Maharashtra. With its primary objectives achieved, the Samiti decided to extend its frontiers and broaden its horizons. As a result, Ramniranjan Jhunjhunwala College came into existence in 1963, enabling a larger section of the society to take advantage of the facilities provided for higher education.

In 1976 the Junior College section was introduced and in 1981 the Commerce Faculty commenced both at the Junior and Degree College level. From 1999-2000 the College has added a number of self-financing and add on courses like BMS, B.B.I, B.Sc. in C.S., I.T., Biotechnology, BMM, M.Sc. in Computer Science and Biotechnology, MA in Entertainment and Media which further catered to the special skills of the students.

2014 saw a change in education system with greater emphasis being given to employability of youth. As an effort to realize the dream of Make in India, Digital India, Clean and Green India, we have started skill based program supported by University Grants commission known as Bachelor in Vocation (B.Voc). The college has received the Best College Award (2007-2008) of the University of Mumbai, bestowed with IMC RAMKRISHNA BAJAJ PERFORMANCE EXCELLENCE TROPHY, 2010, The Principal of the college was awarded "Best Teacher" by Government of Maharashtra in 2011. Government of Maharashtra conferred the college with "JAAGAR JAANIVANCHA" (First in Mumbai Suburban- in 2013 and Second in Mumbai Suburban- in 2014) for safety of girls. # **ABOUT THE WORKSHOP:**

With the onslaught of Globalization, identity of a person in India, which for long was defined mostly in terms of ascribed status (caste, religious community etc) are undergoing rapid transformation, as people are now enjoying the scope of choosing their identity as per their preferences, a phenomenon quite noticeable in case of Indian Women. Noble laurate Amartya Sen's assertion that people in a democracy should have the freedom to choose their identity almost seems to be a reality now in India. In a society where identity of a woman is defined in terms her relationship with her men folk, the data revealed by the 2011 Census that in India now, more than 3.6 crore or 7.4 per cent of women are having single status single seems astonishing as well as revealing of of paradigmatic shift in Indian society. However, most single women particularly in rural areas, are single due to breakdown of marriages and consequently face dispossession and insecurity whereas number of women single by choice, having access to education and employment, mostly in the cities is also rising. Some prominent female politicians of India find their single status an advantage as they are projected as disinterested individuals sacrificing the bliss of conjugal life at the altar of public duty. Whereas the market is responding to the needs of the well--heeled single women by offering sops like special tour packages, the state is still lagging behind to ensure specific welfare and security measures for single women. National Forum for Single Women's Rights has been relentlessly trying to draw attention to exclusion faced by single women as even today, they are socially ostracized and forcefully deprived of economic rights.
