- Review the academic activities undertaken in the second term of the last academic year 2019-20

Following business was transacted during the meeting:

- Prof. Sucheta Joshi, Head, Department of Economics greeted everyone and opened
 the meeting conversations with the discussion of suggestions of the last Board of
 Studies meeting. The syllabus in the last semester along with revision was completed
 before 15th March. However, due to lockdown, suggestions given in the last BoS
 meeting on formulation of tests and scales for assessment of reflective and critical
 thinking could not be implemented. Those suggestions would be implemented in this
 academic year.
- This was followed by discussion and approval on the blended teaching due to lockdown conditions. 50% syllabus is planned currently for online teaching. There were different opinions given on the percentage expected for blended teaching. All members gave their consent for the required online teaching to be done depending on the period of lockdown. All experts raised their concerns on the availability of infrastructure with students for online teaching. However, they were satisfied to know that college authorities and teachers will work to find out solutions to such problems in the course of time.
- The third point of discussion was on the review of academic activities. Syllabus of the college along with revision was completed before 15th March 2020. Two internal tests were also conducted for that semester. However, external exams could not be conducted due to COVID19 pandemic. Departmental activities for the last semester included Forum of Free Enterprises Elocution Competition, Artha Gyaan 2020 in the month of January, Research survey competition in the month of February, guest lecture on the 'Preparations for UPSC and MPSC exams' in the last week of February.
- All the faculties of the Department of Economics presented their own academic engagements during lockdown period.
- Experts gave their suggestions for conducting external exams like open book test, project work to be assigned for 60 marks. The platform of MS Teams was suggested There was a suggestion of students' enrolment in Coursera Courses for students as

well as the teachers. The BoS members highlighted the safety of students during pandemic.

Everyone agreed on the points discussed and the meeting was over with the consent.
