The following business was then transacted

Item 1. Confirmation of minutes of the meeting held on 7th August, 2019. Minutes of the meeting were read and confirmed.

Item 2. Report on the deliberations made on revision of syllabus by respective BOS.

Item 2.1 The revised syllabus for the First year B Sc Undergraduate program recommended by the BOS in Botany in its meeting held on 14th December, 2019, was presented by the chairman Dr Usha Mukundan. The curriculum has been mapped as per UGC recommendations of LOCF.

Resolution 2.1 It was resolved that the syllabus of Undergraduate programs of First Year B Sc Botany as recommended by the BOS in Botany be approved and passed unanimously. This be implemented from the academic year 2020-2021.

Item2.2 The curriculum and paper pattern for semester I, II, III and IV for the new postgraduate programme of Master of science in 'Environmental Science and Disaster management' recommended by the Board of studies in Botany in its meeting held on 14th December, 2019 was presented by the chairman BOS in Botany. A project work of 600 marks is a compulsory component of this program

Resolution 2.2. It was resolved that recommendations made by the BOS in Botany for the curriculum and paper pattern for semesters I, II, III and IV for the new M.Sc. program in 'Environmental Science and Disaster Management' be approved and was passed unanimously. This be implemented from the academic year 2020-2021.

Item 2.3. The chairman BOS in Botany informed that the BOS in Botany has recommended that the students of PG program in Botany shall have a research project work and Internship in semester III which they would do other institution, research institution including industries. In view of this the theory and practical topics have been rearranged in the remaining semester. This in view of making students ready for their future career in industry, academia and or research

Resolution 2.3. It was resolved that the recommendations of BOS in Botany for PG students in Botany to take up project work be approved and passed unanimously and this be implemented from the academic year 2020-2021.



Item 2.4. The Board of studies in Chemistry in its meeting held on 30th November, 2019 approved the curriculum for semester III and IV for PG program in the specialization of 'Analytical chemistry' to be implemented from the academic year 2020-2021.

Resolution 2.4. It was resolved that the recommendations of BOS in Chemistry for the curriculum for semester III and IV for the specialization in Analytical chemistry be approved and passed unanimously and this be implemented from the academic year 2020-2021.

Item 2.5. The syllabus for the undergraduate program in Physics was presented by the Chairman BOS in physics approved in the BOS meeting held on 8/1/2020. During the deliberations in the BOS meeting it was finalized and unanimously agreed upon the incorporation of topic like Thermal and Statistical physics to be introduced in the SY Physics syllabus.

Resolution 2.5. the syllabus for the undergraduate course in physics with the changes proposed in the Second year syllabus was presented by the chairman BOS in Physics and passed unanimously. The experts emphasized on importance of providing students with the simulation via video and computer models to enhance grasping power for the theoretical concepts by the students.

Item 2.6. The department of Mathematics in its BOS meeting held on 13/1/2020approved minor changes in the FY Mathematics syllabus. The members of BOS also felt it necessary to have reallocation of more lectures to some topics over others so as to allot more time to topics which require in depth knowledge and application of mathematical concepts.

Resolution 2.6. It was resolved that the recommendations made by the BOS in Mathematics are approved and accepted for their implementation from the academic year 2020-21.

Item 2.7. In the BOS meeting of department of Computer Science held on 4/1/2020, new topics like "Cyber Forensic' and 'NLP (Neuro Liguistic Program) in deep learning' at under graduate level were proposed and passed. The Chairman BOS in Computer Science presented the details of these topics and also shared the feelings of the BOS members who expressed a view that significance and relevance of every topic in the syllabus should be told to the student so that they start applying their mind as to where and how a given concept be applied and put in practice.

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Resolution 2.7. it was resolved that the introduction of new topics at the undergraduate level as proposed by BOS in Computer Science be accepted and implemented from the academic year 2020-21.

Item 2.8. Department of Information Technology in their BOS meeting held on 11/7/2019 reviewed their undergrad course work curriculum and proposed that the internship in any IT industry can be given as an elective for third year students of IT program. In accordance with the guidelines laid down by the Rules and Regulation Committee, extra credits if can be given to the student for such IT on-site training, then that would motivate students to go out of their comfort zone of college labs and understanding the sector they would be soon stepping inot agter completion of their studies. The proposal to this effect was unanimously passed and accepted in the BOS meeting. Also, at post graduate level, for the proposed new M.Sc. program in 'Data Science & Artificial Intelligence'; the detailed course outline deliberated, discussed, final draft proposed and passed by the BOS in IT.

Resolution 2.8. The details regarding the changes at undergraduate level and at PG level, syllabus in detail for M.Sc. program in 'Data Science & Artificial Intelligence' were presented by the Chairman BOS in IT department were accepted and unanimously passed to be implemented from the academic year 2020-21.

Item 3: Report of the examinations of semester I, III and V of UG and semester I and II PG classes for the academic year 2019-2020

Dr Himanshu Dawda presented the detailed report on the pattern of evaluation and the outcome of UG and PG examinations. He explained about the introduction of open house for students so that they can see their answer books. As a result, the grievances are negligible. Timely declaration of results so as to enable students to prepare for courses which they have not cleared.

Item 8 : Any other matter

The chairman of the academic council Principal Usha Mukundan thanked all the illustrious members of the Academic Council for their valuable inputs and support and informed that she would be retiring on 31st March, 2020 on superannuation and officially this is her last academic council meeting.
