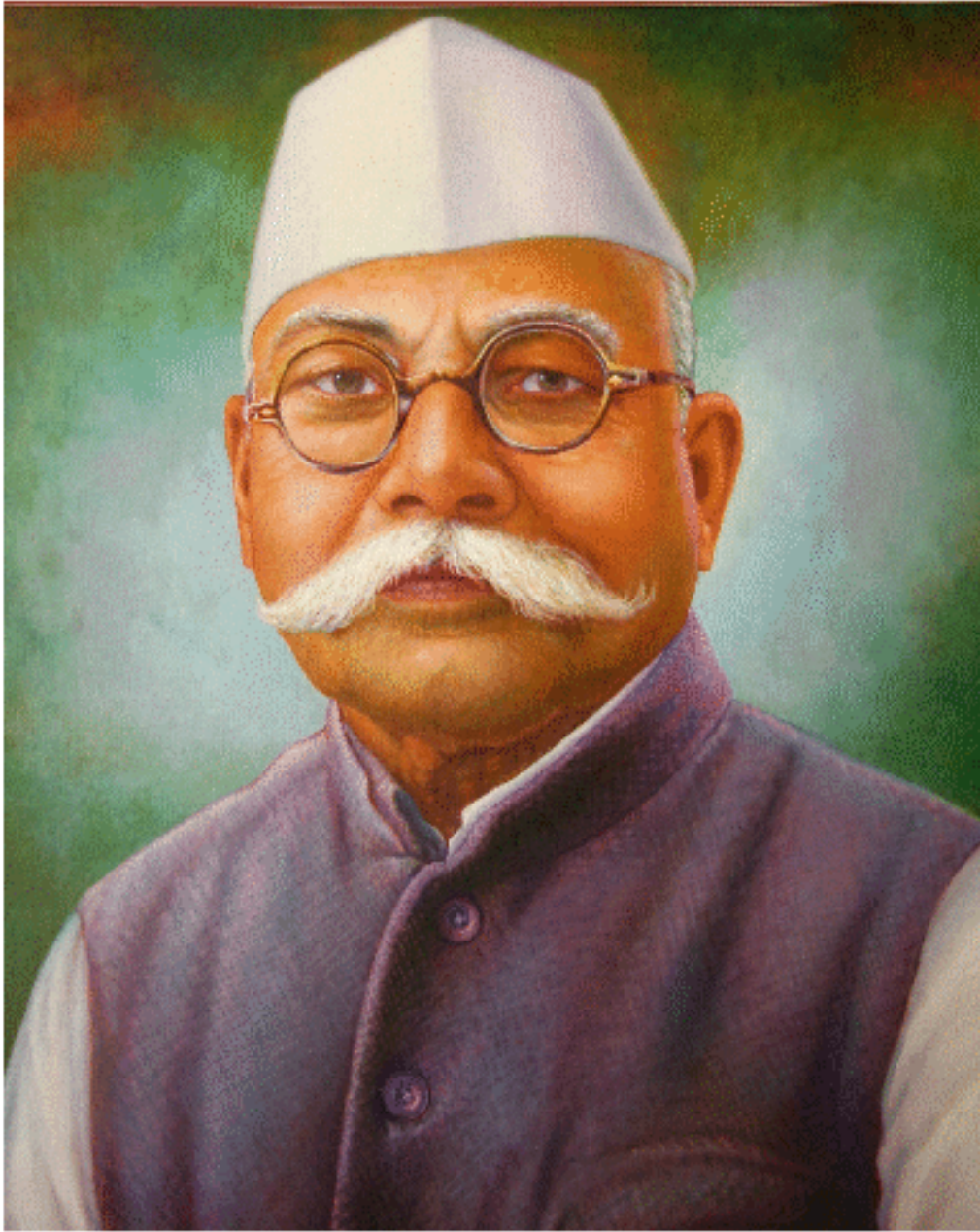

## DOCUMENT & CERTIFICATES



### A. DOCUMENTS ISSUED BY THE COLLEGE OFFICE

#### 1. Bonafide Certificate:

Students who are admitted to the Junior or Degree College are eligible to get a bonafide certificate on application and payment of Rs.20/- (Rupees Twenty only.)

#### 2. Railway Concession:

Only bonafide students of the college for the academic year (male students below 25 years and all girl students) are eligible for Railway concession on their season tickets between the stations nearest to their home and Ghatkopar. The student has to apply in a prescribed form of application available at the college office between 9.30 a.m. to 1.00 p.m. on any working day. Long Journey Railway Concession is granted only for the vacation period according to rules of the Railways for commuting to their native places as mentioned in their admission forms.

#### 3. Transcript:

Students seeking transcripts are required to apply on a plain paper giving full details (Marksheets and relevant documents) to the Principal. Following the verification of the documents and payment of Rs.1000/- to the cashier, four copy of the transcript will be provided. Additional copies Rs. 50 will be charged per copy of the transcript.

#### 4. Transfer Certificate:

The rules for issuing Transfer Certificate are as per the ordinance given below:

**0.131** If, as a result of a student leaving one college to join another, it will be necessary for him to count the attendance kept by him in more than one college to enable him to make up the necessary number of attendance, a Transfer certificate shall not be granted except for reasons which appear to the executive council to be sufficient and except with the written permission of the Principal of the college which he intends to join. Provided, however, that in the event of a student leaving one college to join another after the completion of a term, or terms, it will be necessary for him to obtain the written permission from the Principal of the college which he desires to leave and the Principal of the college which he intends to join.

**0.132** Student shall make application of Transfer Certificate without unnecessary delay through the Principal of the college to which they wish to be transferred.

#### 5. Recommendation Letter:

Student applying for post graduate courses to Indian or Foreign Universities may apply on a plain paper giving the purpose for which the recommendation letter is sought and other personal and academic details and the name of faculty from whom such a letter is sought. The Principal on scrutiny of the application will issue relevant instructions to the office to do the needful.

#### 6. College Examination Grade Card (Marksheets):

Students of First, Second and Third Year Degree College will be issued marksheets for Semesters I, II, III, IV, V and VI examinations as per choice based credit system.

For Students of Postgraduate program marksheets will be issued for Semesters I, II, III and IV.

#### 7. College Leaving Certificate:

Students who have passed XII<sup>th</sup> standard examination will be issued a college leaving certificate.

### B. DOCUMENTS TO BE SUBMITTED BY THE STUDENT

#### 1. Provisional Eligibility:

A student from another University or Board of Secondary or Intermediate Education or any other statutory examining body, seeking admission to this University/College shall apply to the Registrar, University of Mumbai for a certificate of eligibility. Such students will not be admitted to any class, if they have not obtained the provisional certificate of Eligibility from the Registrar, University of Mumbai.

After being admitted to the college on the basis of the provisional eligibility certificate, the students have to obtain final confirmation and eligibility for which they will be required to submit the following certificates in original along with a certified xerox copy.

- Original Mark Sheet
- Original Passing Certificate
- Original Migration Certificate.

Those students whose admission is provisional should note that if the Registrar does not finally confirm their admission, their terms will be treated as 'Null and Void' and they will not be allowed to appear for the final examination. Foreign students will have to show documentary evidence of conversion of their visa in addition to the above condition for eligibility.

### **2. Caste Certificate for Validation:**

It is applicable only to students belonging to S.C/S.T. /V.J./N.T./O.B.C. /S.B.C./Nav Buddha who wish to take admission in professional colleges after passing H.S.C. examination. For the validation of the above certificates, the student has to submit original caste certificate along with two attested xerox copies and a copy of caste certificate of any of his/her close relative and attested Xerox copy of first and last page of ration-card on or before 15<sup>th</sup> October 2021.

### **3. Migration Certificate:**

When a student of Mumbai University, either enrolled in an affiliated college or registered with the University wishes to leave the University to join any other University/Board for pursuing any course of study, he has to obtain a migration certificate from this University. A Student is required to apply in the prescribed form for the migration certificate to the Registrar of the University through the Principal of the college/institution last attended by him.

The application for migration certificate has to be accompanied by the Transfer Certificate in original and a copy thereof.

A duplicate copy of the migration certificate will not be issued under any circumstances.

If for any reason the student fails to join the University/Board that he had proposed to join, he shall return the Migration Certificate issued to him within three months from the date of issue of the migration certificate for cancellation through the Principal of the college/institution through which he applied for the migration certificate.

### **4. Transfer Certificate:**

The rules for submitting Transfer Certificate to the college are as per the ordinance given below:

**0.126** No Student shall at any time be admitted to any other college unless he/she produces Transfer Certificate from the College he/she leaves.

**0.120** The Principal shall be entitled to charge a fee of Rs.100/- for issuing a Transfer Certificate. Subject to the provisions of ordinance 130, when a Principal receives an application for a Transfer Certificate more than a month after the opening of a term, he/she may levy an additional fee of Rs.20/- per term that has lapsed since the applicant attended the college, provided however that the fee charged under the ordinance shall not exceed Rs.200/- in the aggregate.

## REFUND OF FEES



### DEGREE COLLEGE

The Rules (Ordinance 2859) relating to refund of fees after cancellation of admission as per the **University of Mumbai Circular No. UG/412 of 2008 dated 11.09.2008** is given below:  
The candidates who have taken admission in under graduate courses in aided and unaided courses conducted by affiliated Colleges may request for refund of fees after applying in writing for cancellation of their admission to the course. The refund of fees as applicable shall be made on or before 30th day after the date of cancellation and thereafter.

### *Table for fee deduction on cancellation of Admission*

- *Cancellation should be done by student on his online portal only. No offline cancellation will be accepted.*
- *Refund of fees at the time of cancellation will be made only via online bank transfer within 10 working days.*
- *Online bank transfer will be in the name of Student/Parent only.*

**Important instructions for Reserve Category student:**

Eligible Reserve Category students who are admitted to the College on payment of concessional fees prescribed by the University of Mumbai are requested to remain informed that, on cancellation of admission they will be required to pay additional amount depending on the period and percentage of deduction charges of the total fees prescribed for the course.

## GENERAL RULES

1. Every student must possess an Identity Card and Library Card. A fees of Rs.150/- will be collected along with other fees at the time of admission towards the cost of these cards. As soon as College reopens each student will be issued an Identity Card and a Library Card. Students must affix a recent passport size photograph on each of these cards.
2. During College hours every student must wear the lanyard carrying their Identity Card and must produce it whenever he/she is called upon to do so by the authorities.
3. Students are expected to attend lectures/practical's/tutorials regularly and should not remain absent without permission from the Principal. Attendance will be taken daily during lectures/practical/tutorials. Students who are irregular in attendance, and whose progress in various college tests/examinations is not satisfactory will not be granted their terms.

N.B: The attention of students is drawn to Ordinance 0.119 and 0.115 of the University of Mumbai which are reproduced below:

### University Ordinance 0.119

In the Faculty of Arts / Science / Commerce the minimum attendance for keeping terms will be three-fourths of the days on which lectures/practical's are conducted.

### University Ordinance 0.115

1. To keep a term at a College, a student must complete to the satisfaction of the Principal the courses of the studies prescribed for that term of the class to which the undergraduate belongs.
2. Students are expected to maintain proper discipline in the class as well as within the College premises and ensure that no disturbance is caused to fellow students of the other classes.
3. Students shall not indulge in anything inside or outside the College that will in any way interfere with the discipline standards set forth by the college and amount to violation of Code of Conduct applicable to students.
4. Student shall not loiter in the corridors while the classes are in progress.

5. Students should help in keeping the college premises tidy and should not damage any property of the college by disfiguring walls, doors, fittings & furniture etc.
6. Students should not communicate any information to the press or write in the press about any matter concerning the college without the permission of the Principal.
7. If for any reason, the continuance of a student in the college is found to be detrimental to the best interest of the college in the opinion of the Principal, he/she will be asked to leave the college.
8. Government or College Scholarship/Free Studentship will be granted only to such student who are regular in attendance and whose conduct and progress are satisfactory.
9. It is the responsibility of students to see notice boards regularly and also check official subject/class group on WhatsApp and fill up the respective forms for freeships/scholarships from government. Students changing from one College to another will be required to produce a No Objection Certificate from the Principal of the College previously attended as well as from Director of Education and/or Social Welfare Officer.
10. Smoking/Chewing Pan/Tobacco and Spitting are strictly prohibited in the college.
11. There is Zero Tolerance to any Gender Discrimination on Campus and "Respect to One and all is the policy every RJ must adapt.
12. Matters not covered by the existing rules will rest at the discretion of the Principal.

## EXAMINATION & EVALUATION



### F.Y./S.Y./ T.Y. B.A./B.Com./B.Sc. Degree College Examination

In 2011, University of Mumbai has introduced Credit Based Semester and Grading System (CBSGS) for Degree College students and is applicable to the students (learners) admitted (enrolled) for Undergraduate and Postgraduate degree programs under the faculties of Arts, Science & Commerce. It is applicable to both traditional & self-financing undergraduate and postgraduate degree programs for all three faculties of Arts, Science & Commerce. From the academic year 2018-19, the college has been granted 'Autonomous College affiliated to Mumbai University' status jointly by University Grants Commission, New Delhi and University of Mumbai and from 2023, an empowered Autonomous Status from Government of Maharashtra. The following rules and regulations are applicable for the academic assessment of the students.

1. In every semester, the College will conduct three assessments for all theory courses. Two Internal Assessments (IA1) and (IA2), one of 15 Marks Assignment & other of 25 marks will be conducted. Thus, 40% of the total marks per course will be evaluated through continuous evaluation method. (Under NEP 2020, there will be only one Internal Assessments of either 20 or 25 Marks).
2. One Semester End Examination (SEE) of 30 or 40 marks (as applicable) for the duration of 1 or 2 hours respectively, for the remaining 60% of the total marks of the said course.
3. Learner (student) must appear at least one IA Examination to be eligible for appearing for SEE. In other words, a student who has appeared for IA1 or IA2 or both can ONLY appear for SEE.

4. There will be no retests for the IAs. Every student must appear for SEE. Any student who misses either IA1 or IA2 should acquire the 40% required to pass the course through the combination IA attended and SEE.
5. If a student fails to score 40% in the overall total in a given paper of any course, such a student will have to appear for the 60 marks Examination in the next academic year and his/her score of IA1 and/or IA2 will remain valid for Six years (inclusive of the year of Enrollment).
6. For Science Program, the Practical component per course is for 50 marks in each paper. FYBSc (2 Course /Semester), SYBSc (2 Course / Semester) and TYBSc under Non-NEP (4 main Course and 1 applied component / Semester).
7. In science faculty, to clear Practical Examination, a student is required to secure a minimum of 40% of the total marks allotted for the practicals in the said course. Appearing for individual practical is mandatory.
8. At any of the post graduate courses, a student is required to obtain a minimum of 16 out of 40 marks in Internal examination and minimum 24 out of 60 marks in External examination (together 40% of the total marks allotted to that course).
9. The facility for obtaining Duplicate copy of the Grade Card is available to all learners. The learner shall apply to Examination Cell (EC) in a prescribed form and pay the fees towards the duplicate copy as per University Circular No. Cert/1854 of 2006. EC would require 7 working days, starting from the date of application.
10. For the details regarding passing standards, Gracing rules, ATKT rules, verification and photocopy rules, performance grade calculation chart, SGPA and CGPA calculations and relevant ordinances to that effect can be obtained from the college website.
11. Student seeking admission in R J College is also advised to regularly visit collegewebsite for all examination related notices and announcements.
12. All rules and regulations mentioned above are subject to change as per updates and announcements received from UGC, Mumbai University, and State Government Authorities.

## SCHOLARSHIPS AND FREESHIPS



*Students who have sought concession in fees on the basis of Scholarship/Freeship but failed to fill the Scholarship/Freeship form before the due date or were not eligible for the Scholarship/Freeship will have to pay the balance fees.*

### ELIGIBILITY FOR SCHOLARSHIP/FREESHIP:

- For SC/ST income limit for Scholarship is below 2,00,000/-
- For OBC/VJNT/SBC income limit for Scholarship is below 1,00,000/-
- For SC/ST income limit for Freeship is above 2,00,000/-
- For VJNT/SBC/OBC income limit for Freeship is above 1,00,000/- up to 4,50,000/-
- All Freeship & Scholarship Students have to open Student Account with Corporation Bank, Ghatkopar (W) Branch for online disbursement of amount from the Government, failing which the Scholarship will not be granted
- Students must write Mobile / Contact Number in the application form.
- The college will not be responsible for any claim under Freeship / Scholarship in case students do not submit the required documents by 31st July of the academic year or the claim is rejected by Govt. such students will have to pay full fees of the academic year.
- Students who have been admitted from other than Maharashtra State are not eligible to receive fees concession.
- Students can only avail of any one scholarship or freeship from only one course or department of Government Authorities.

## CAMPUS LIBRARY

The College also runs a Study Centre which provides facilities to students of other Colleges residing in/near Ghatkopar. The Library and study Centre are closed on Sundays and Public Holidays. 4. Students should desist from marking library books with pencil or ink or mutilating them. Books found damaged/mutilated must be brought to the notice of librarian at time of issue, failing

#### HINDI CENTRE

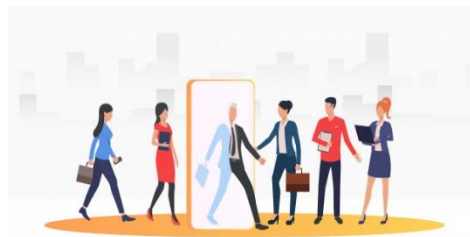

#### ANTI RAGGING SQUAD

The College has an Anti-Ragging Squad and Anti-Ragging Committee. Ragging is totally banned in the college. Ragging would be met with exemplary punishment. A Student found guilty of ragging earlier will not be admitted. The college strictly follows all the regulations as mentioned in the **“Coregulations on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions,2009”**. All students will give an undertaking that he or she is aware of the law regarding prohibition of ragging as well as the punishments, and that he/she if found guilty of the offence of ragging and /or abetting ragging is liable to be punished appropriately. A similar undertaking shall be taken from the parents that they are also aware of the law in this regard.

Students and parents are informed that ragging is banned and shall be considered as a serious offence which will attract severe punishment. Parents are requested to emphasize on their wards the seriousness of the offence and instruct them not to indulge in ragging.

Important aspects of the Regulation are given below:

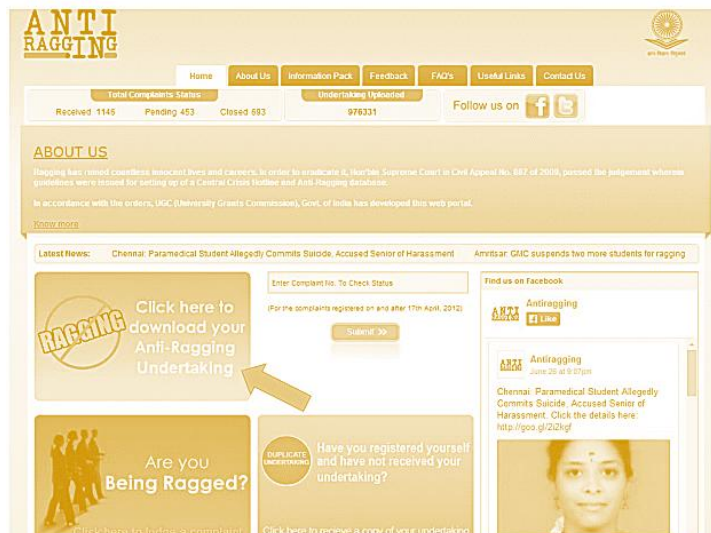
1. **What constitutes Ragging:** Ragging constitutes one or more of any of the following acts:
  - a. any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student;
  - b. indulging in rowdy or indisciplined activities by any student or students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student;
  - c. asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student;

- d. any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher;
  - e. exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students,
  - f. any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student by students;
  - g. any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person;
  - h. any act or abuse by spoken words, emails, post, public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other student;
  - i. any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student.
2. **Action to be taken by the Head of the Institution:** On receipt of the recommendation of the Anti-Ragging Squad or on receipt of any information concerning any reported incident of ragging, the Head of institution shall immediately determine if a case under the penal laws is made out and if so, either on his own or through a member of the Anti-Ragging Committee authorized by him in this behalf, proceed to file a First Information Report (FIR), within twenty four hours of receipt of such information or recommendation, with the police and local authorities, under the appropriate penal provisions mentioned in the *“UGC Regulations on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions,2009”*.
3. **Administrative action in the event of ragging:** The institution shall punish a student found guilty of ragging after following the procedure mentioned in the *“UGC Regulations on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions,2009”*.

# THE STORY OF NANDKISHOR SINGH JAIRAMJI



## *A Journey from Dust to Legacy*

Born in 1897 in a small village in Uttar Pradesh, Nandkishor's formal education spanned just two years. But his experiences as a World War I corporal in the Middle East broadened his worldview. Joining the Post and Telegraphs Department in 1926 as a postman, he sought a purposeful life, finding it in the struggling school.

Using his connections as a postman, Nandkishor launched a community collection drive, gathering donations—even a few paise—from local residents. In 1946, his “Deewali baksheesh” collection and a play staged for fundraising brought in ₹12,000, enabling the purchase of a 3,300 sq. yard plot near Ghatkopar Station. Laying the foundation stone himself, he gathered donors to fund new classrooms. By 1947, the school's new building opened with 80 students.

Undeterred by challenges, he built the first floor on faith, later raising funds through a play by Prithviraj Kapoor and an anonymous donation of ₹44,000. In four years, the building stood tall, a testament to perseverance and community support.

Nandkishor's vision extended beyond the school. He mortgaged the school to purchase adjacent land for a college building, starting with just ₹18,000 raised by students and teachers. Despite financial hardships and a construction standstill, a one-rupee collection drive in 1959, a ₹100,000 loan from the school committee, and a ₹200,000 donation from Shri R R Jhunjhunwala in 1963 finally brought the college to life.

By the early 1970s, the humble 1938 school with 11 boys had blossomed into an educational hub with 2,200 students in school and 2,700 in college, offering education from primary to post-graduate levels.

Nandkishor didn't stop there. Turning his attention to his hometown, Rampur Manjha, UP, he founded a high school in 1965, the only one in the region. His goal was to establish a college there by 1970, with efforts underway to raise ₹35,000 for its foundation.

Today, the Hindi Vidya Prachar Samiti, born from Nandkishor's vision, serves as an educational beacon with more than 15,000 students across its schools and colleges. The institution continues to expand, establishing new centers of learning such as the Hindi Vidya Prachar Samiti Law College and the Shri Indradeo Singh International School, further strengthening its legacy.

Nandkishor's journey is a living example of a “Karmayogi”—a man who believed in duty, perseverance, and faith in God. His story, echoing the squirrels of the Ramayana, shows that even the humblest contributions can build bridges—between dreams and reality.
